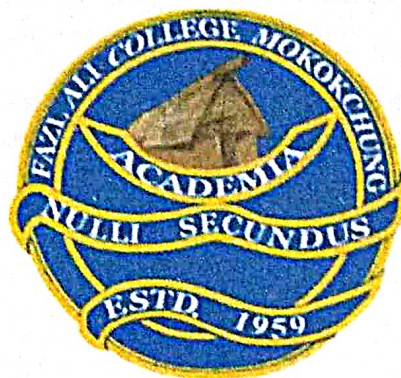

Fazl Ali College is the first College in Nagaland. It was established as a private College on 8<sup>th</sup> Sept' 1959 with the initiative of a few visionary individuals. It was taken over by the State Government on 1<sup>st</sup> March 1962. Science stream was introduced from 1983 and the College is expecting to start the Commerce stream in a year or two. This is the oldest Government College in Mokokchung District. It is the first Government College to be accredited by NAAC and has gone through the 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of NAAC accreditation. The yed Fazl Ali, the then Governor of Assam.

The College is located in a beautiful lillock surrounded by fascinating landscape which was generously donated by the villages of Chuchuyimpang and Mokokchung. It is 5 kms away from Mokokchung Town with good road connectivity and is not far from the Nagaland University Headquarters, Lumami.

The College has a large auditorium, College cafe and recreation centre, and a spacious playground. It has 4 (four) Government Hostels, two each for boys and girls. C.C.T.V surveillance cameras have been installed in and around the College building and Library.

The College has a welfare fund (with contribution from teachers) which gives financial assistance to financially needy students and differently-abled students. The College also encourages the students by giving Meritorious Awards like, Chubaingla Academic Award for topper, Akok Walling Debater of the Year Award, Linnaeus Award, EU Student of the Year Award, Dr. Longrizung Academic Award etc.

The College is working hard to become an autonomous College and is planning to offer P.G.Courses in the years to come. The College will continue to uphold its motto "Academia Nulli Secundus" which means second to none in Academics

#### 5. Other Activities

- i. In order to maintain financial transparency and expedite various developmental works in the College, funds collected from internal sources were allocated to respective Departments/Committees. Some important committees include Laboratory Development Committee, Library Advisory Committee, IQAC, and College Development-cum-Construction Committee. Laboratory Development Committee comprising of all HoDs of those departments with laboratories as members. The Committee directly handles all funds collected from students’ practical fees and any fund/matter related to laboratory development. Library Advisory Committee handles all Library development fees and Library Caution money. IQAC handles the IQAC fees collected during admission. College Development cum Construction Committee handles all College Development fees collected during the admission. The Committee consists of Principal, Vice Principal, Head Assistant, Accountant and some senior teachers. This Committee plans and carry out the various developmental works on priority basis.

- ii. The Students Welfare Fund which was set up to help the economically needy students is being generously funded by the College teachers. A total of 29 students received the welfare fund from January to May 2017. 12 students are currently receiving the fund since September month.
- iii. The College Journal is being sponsored by the College teachers.
- iv. Teachers have financially contributed to the developmental and renovation works of the College.
- v. Cash prizes for all the categories of competition during the Annual Literary Day were sponsored by the teachers.
- vi. Staffs have voluntarily contributed their labour in all the developmental and renovation works of the College.
- vii. The College continues to present the various academic awards which are being externally sponsored by Trust or individuals such as the Chubainla Academic Award for Topper (CAAT), Akok Walling Debator of the Year Award, Linnaeus Award, EU Student of the Year Award and Dr. Longrizung Academic Award.
- viii. The College provides subsidized rate for photocopying at '1 per page.
- ix. Special generator service is provided to Library to reduce the inconvenience of power fluctuations.
- x. In addition to the normal duties, the College assist the District Administration in various responsibilities entrusted from time to time specially in the conduct of District Level Recruitment Examination held in between 12<sup>th</sup> May to 21<sup>st</sup> August 2017.
- xi. The College also performed all the duties assigned by the Nagaland University.
- xii. To maintain discipline, College uniform was made mandatory for all students on all working days.
- xiii. FACSU Election Reform: In order to reduce the tensions and unnecessary problems created during elections to students' union, College has discouraged canvassing for elections but introduced free and fair elections for Class Representatives (CRs). Executive members are now selected from CRs by a Selection Board based on merit and ability.
- xiv. The College expressed its gratitude to the Department for arranging a special administrative training for the Principals at Administrative Training Institute, Kohima with effect from 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> August 2017.



## xv. Infrastructure Developmental Activities

### 7.1. Construction:

- i. Constructed an extended Porch in front of the Auditorium with the College Logo in it.
- ii. The side and front areas of the Auditorium were levelled and plastered with concrete.
- iii. Railing on the side of the Auditorium has been constructed.
- iv. For easier access to the Auditorium, a footstep from the main College gate to the Auditorium has been constructed
- v. 12 stone slabs for sitting purpose have been constructed in the outdoor for the students.
- vi. Ramps, railings and a toilet for the differently-abled were constructed through funding by Social Welfare Department, Government of Nagaland making the College differently-abled friendly.
- vii. A water filtration plant with anticipated expenditure of about `4 lakh to filter water from the bore well in under construction. This filtration plant will serve the College, campus dwellers and College Hostels.
- viii. Landmarks/Signboards of the College were placed at three different junctions leading to the College.
- ix. Construction of Commerce Building is under progress.

### 7.2. Renovations:

- i. Renovation and relocation of Office and few departmental rooms were done
- ii. Renovated rooms were carpeted and installed with ceiling fans and exhaust fans
- iii. All the 5 store rooms in Auditorium were repaired and made useable.
- iv. Dressing rooms for both boys and girls in the Auditorium were renovated. The dressing mirrors were fixed.
- v. The toilet attached to the Auditorium was renovated and a wash basin with water connection was provided.
- vi. Auditorium walls and railings were painted.
- vii. 3 LED Flash Lights were installed in the stage of the Auditorium.
- viii. The floor of the College Library was carpeted

### 7.3. Augmentations

- i. Water pipe connection to Principal's Office was made and a wash basin was installed.
- ii. Water pipe connection and sufficient water supply have been provided to all the toilets, Library and Auditorium.
- iii. 430 (four hundred and thirty) new books were added to the Library
- iv. 9 (nine) new book racks were purchased for the Library
- v. 3 more PA Lectern Systems were purchased for classroom usage
- vi. A ceiling mount projector was installed in the Physics Honours classroom.
- vii. Existing CCTV cameras were upgraded and augmented with 7 more CCTV cameras. A total of 29 CCTV cameras are operational in the College.
- viii. Installed at total of 26,000 (twenty six thousand) litre capacity water reservoir which includes four 5000 litre syntax, two 2000 litre syntax and two 1000 litre syntax.
- ix. Installed Aqua Guard for providing drinking water
- x. Additional electrical wiring was carried out.
- xi. In order to save power consumption, most of the light bulbs were replaced by around 100 LED bulbs. The process is still continuing.
- xii. In order to provide stable power supply for electronic gadgets, 14 stabilizers were purchased for various departments and library.
- xiii. 12 Solar Street lamps have been installed in and around the College campus and one each in the two girls' hostels.
- xiv. College received some books from the Parliamentary Secretary through the Directorate of Higher Education.
- xv. College received a new bus from the Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Shürhozelie Liezietsu through the Directorate of Higher Education.
- xvi. College received 10 computer sets including computer tables and chairs, 1 printer and a projector from the Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Shürhozelie Liezietsu through the Directorate of Higher Education.

#### 6. Laboratories

- i. Computer Science Department added 16 computer sets through NEC fund.
- ii. Laboratories of Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Physics and Zoology were also upgraded through NEC fund and internal fund.

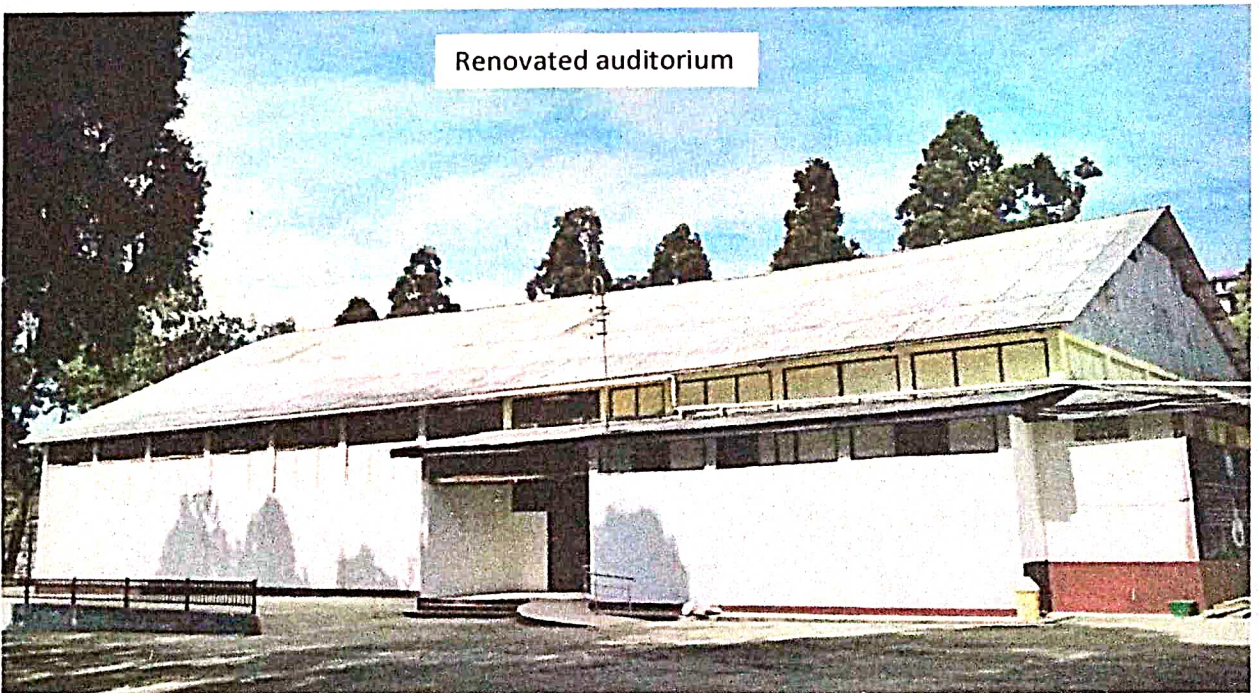
#### 8. RUSA

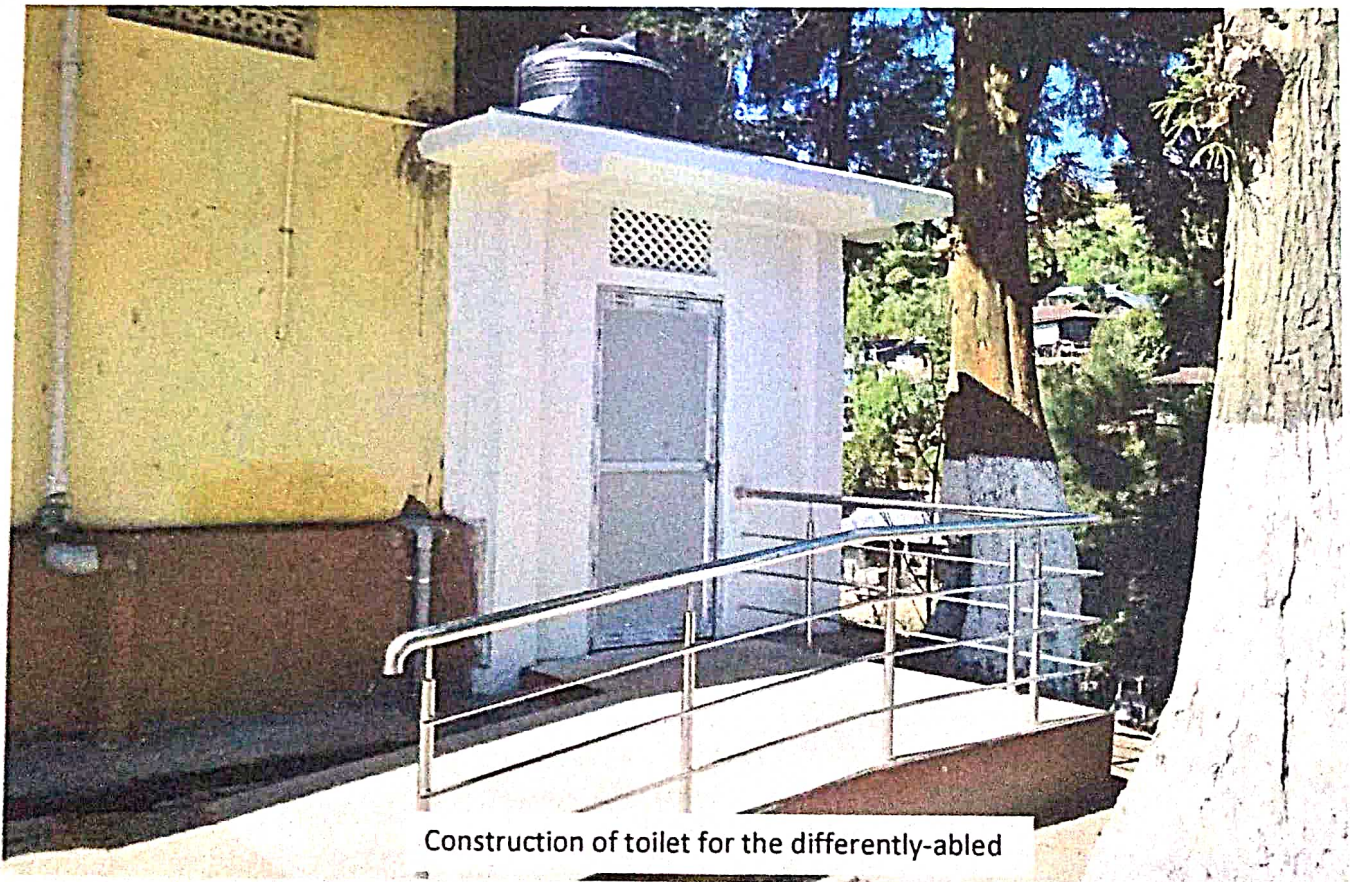
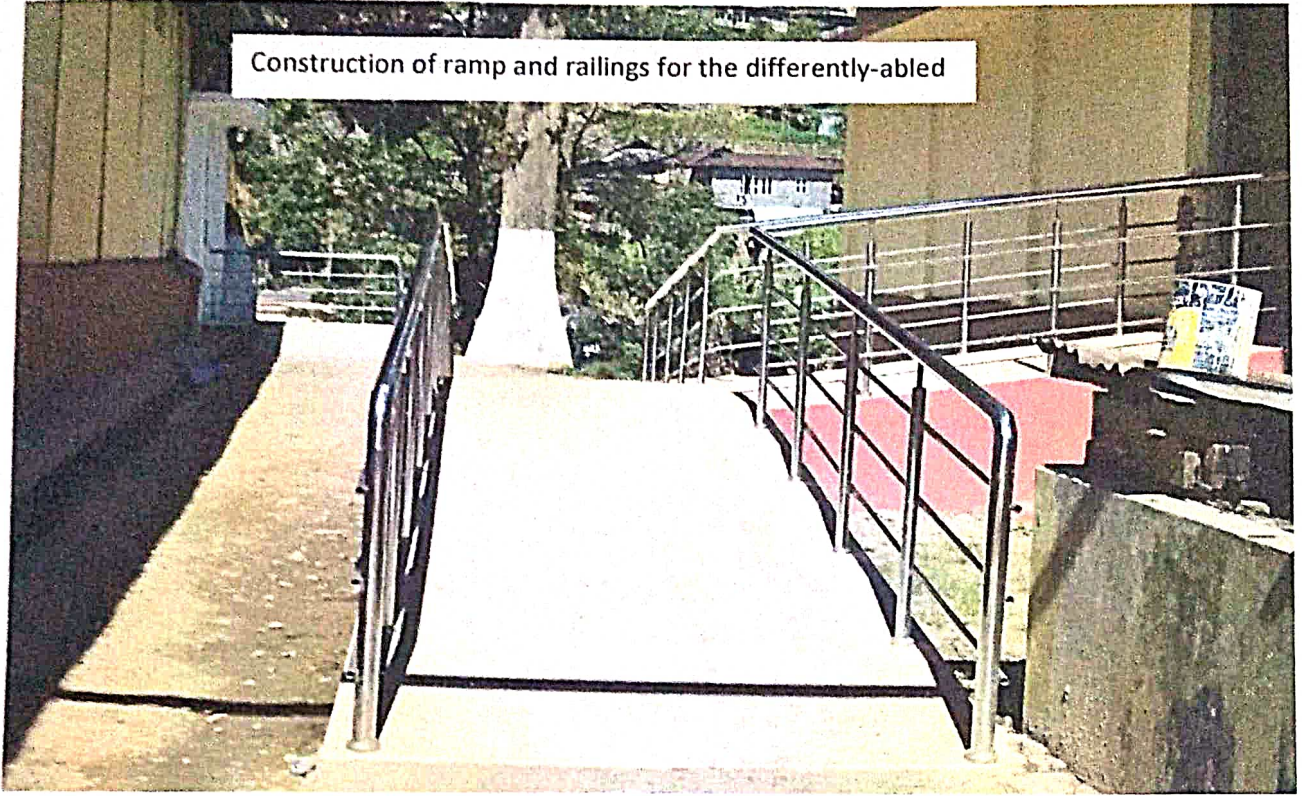

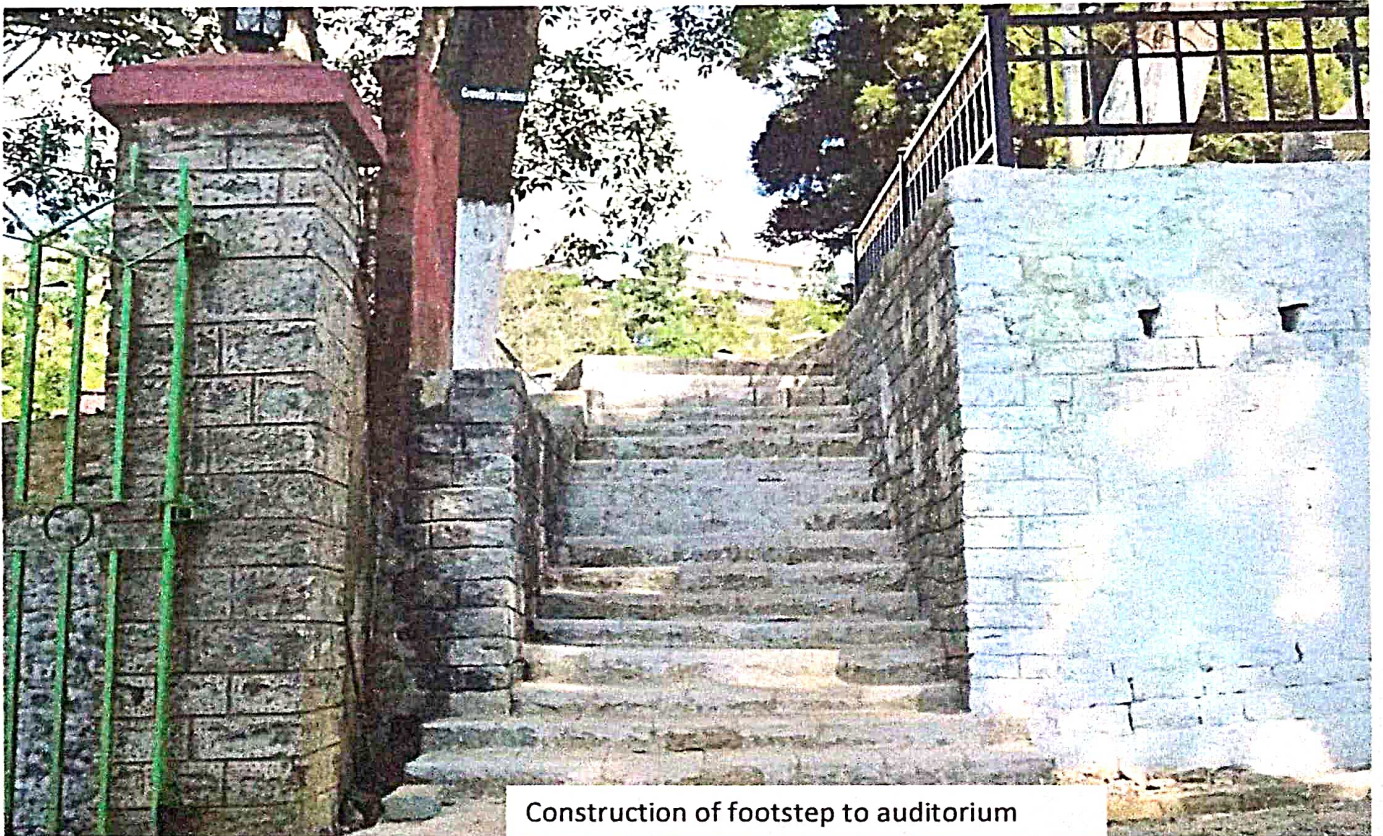

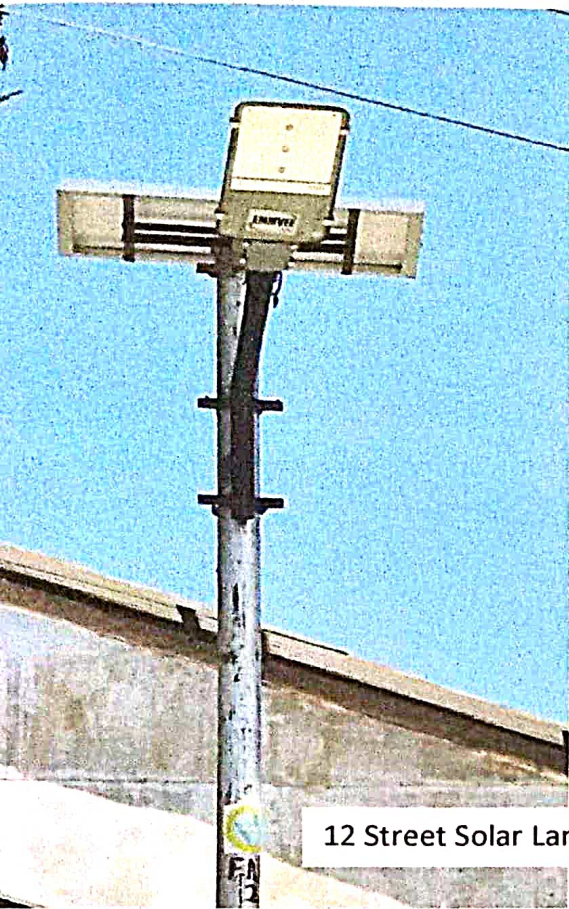

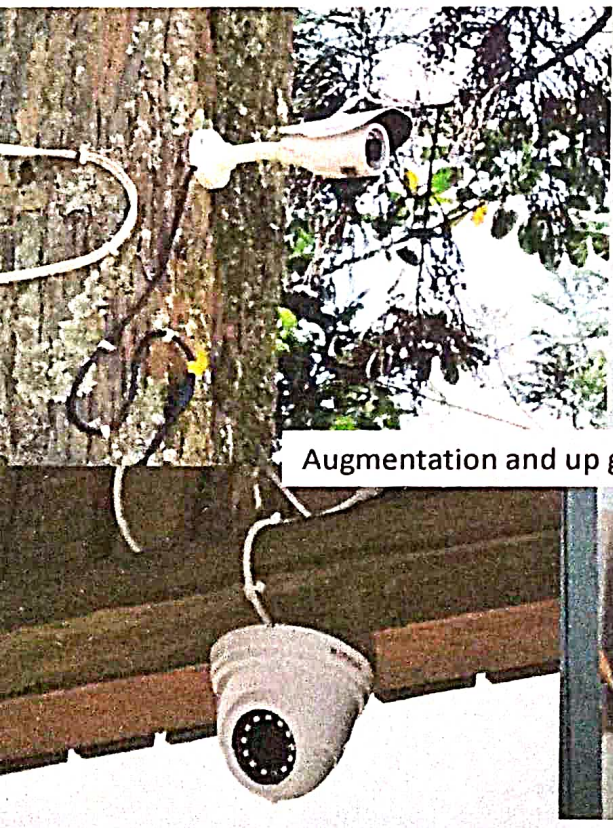
Construction of auditorium railing

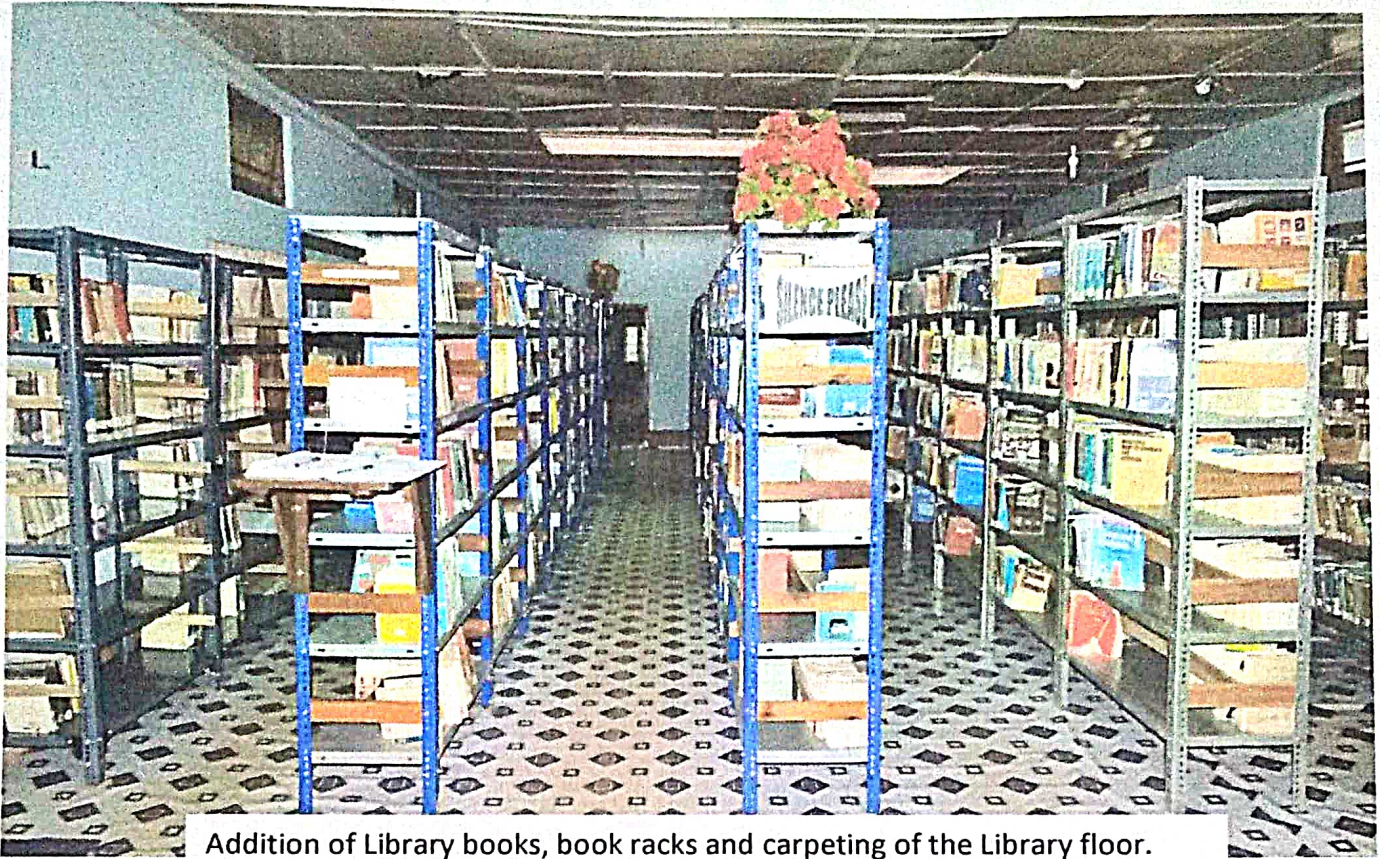

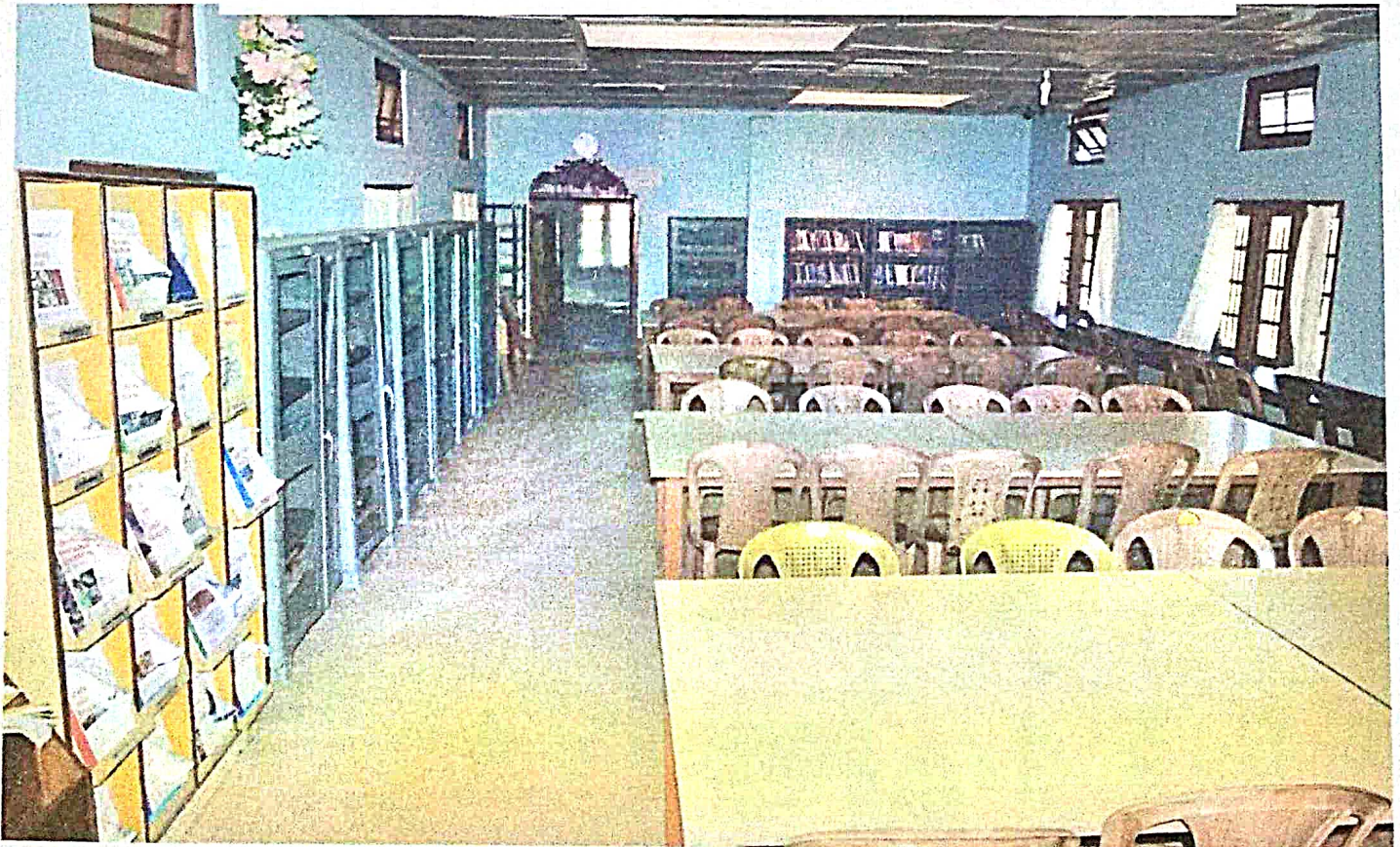

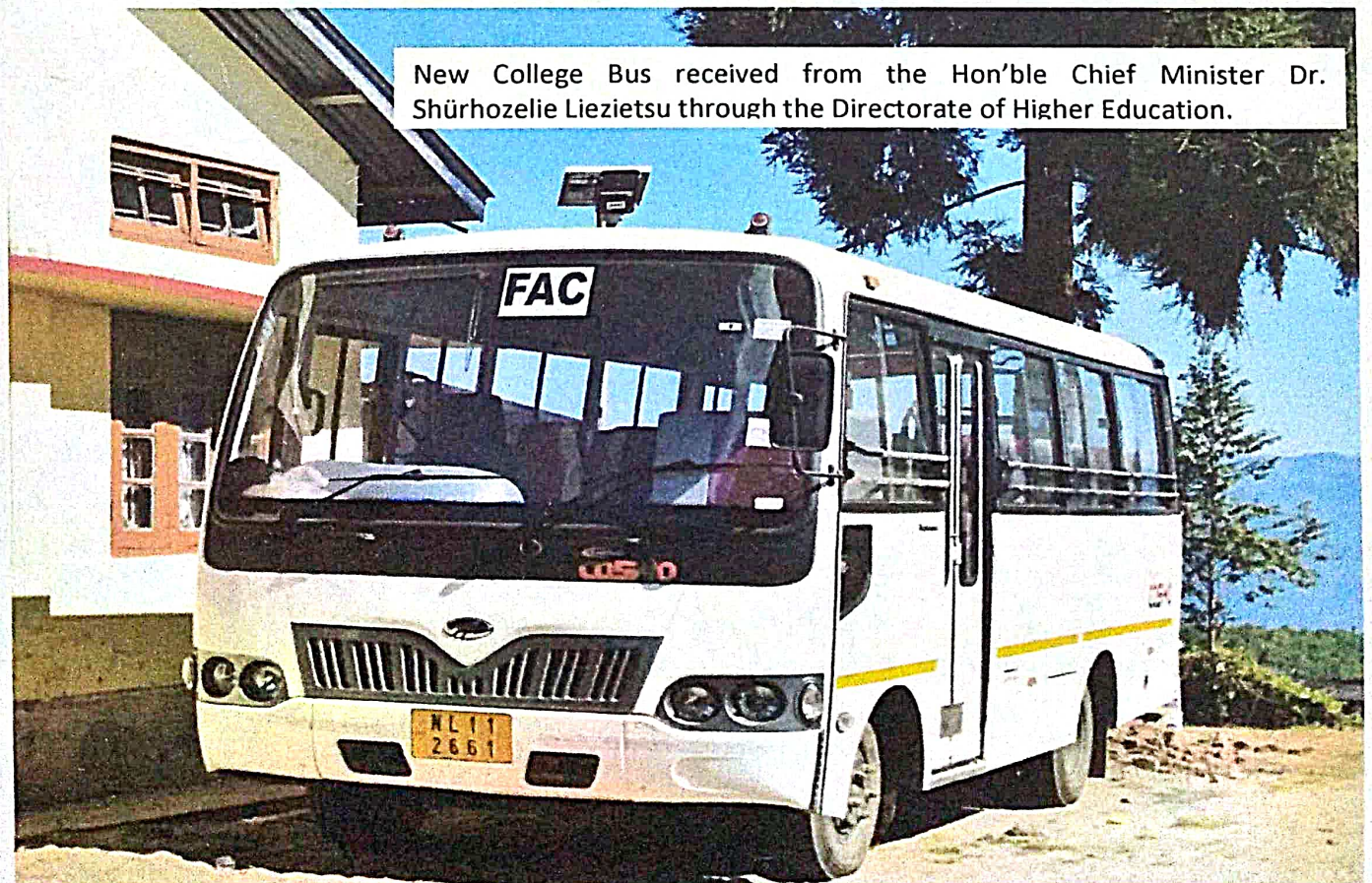

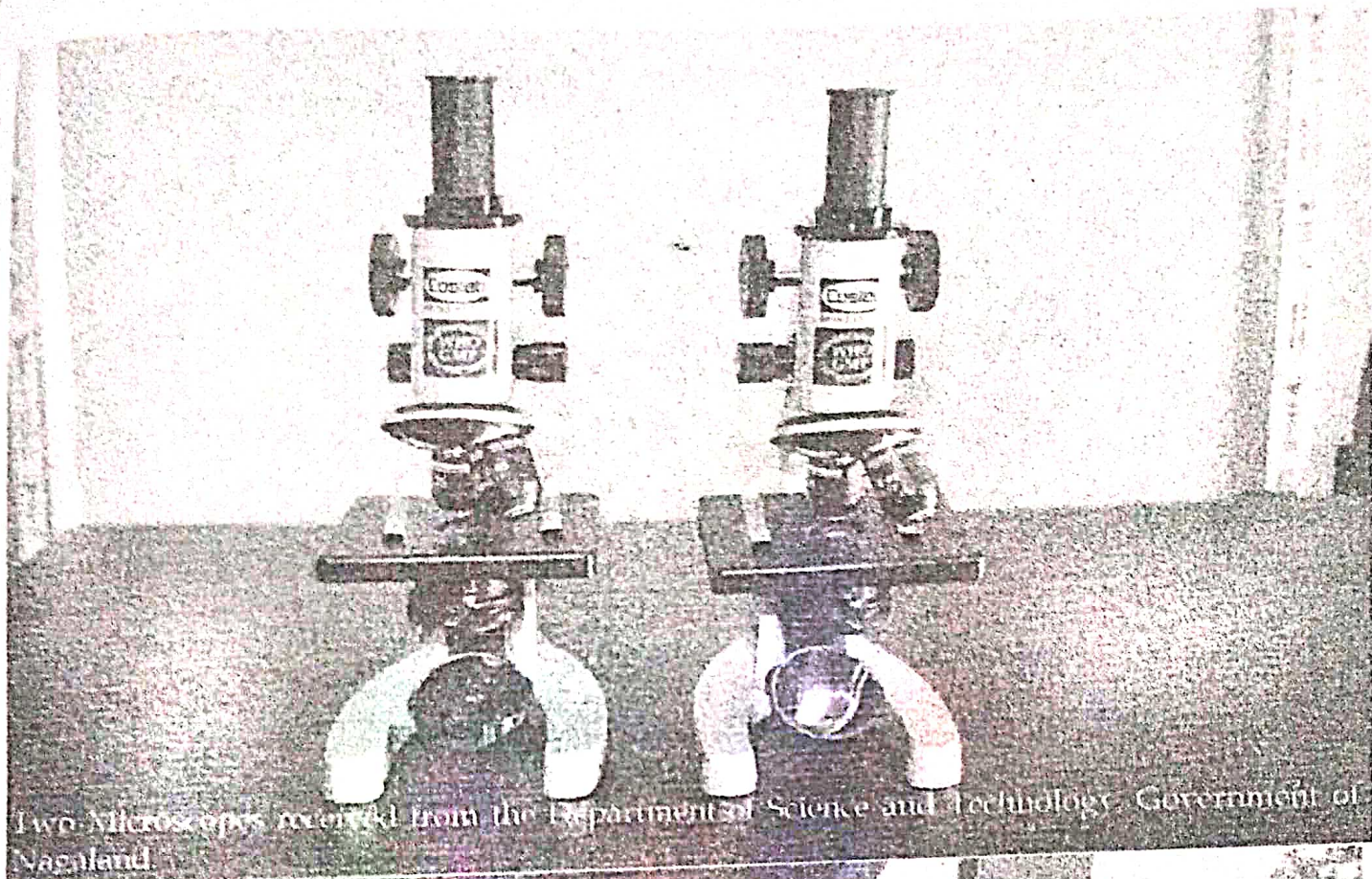




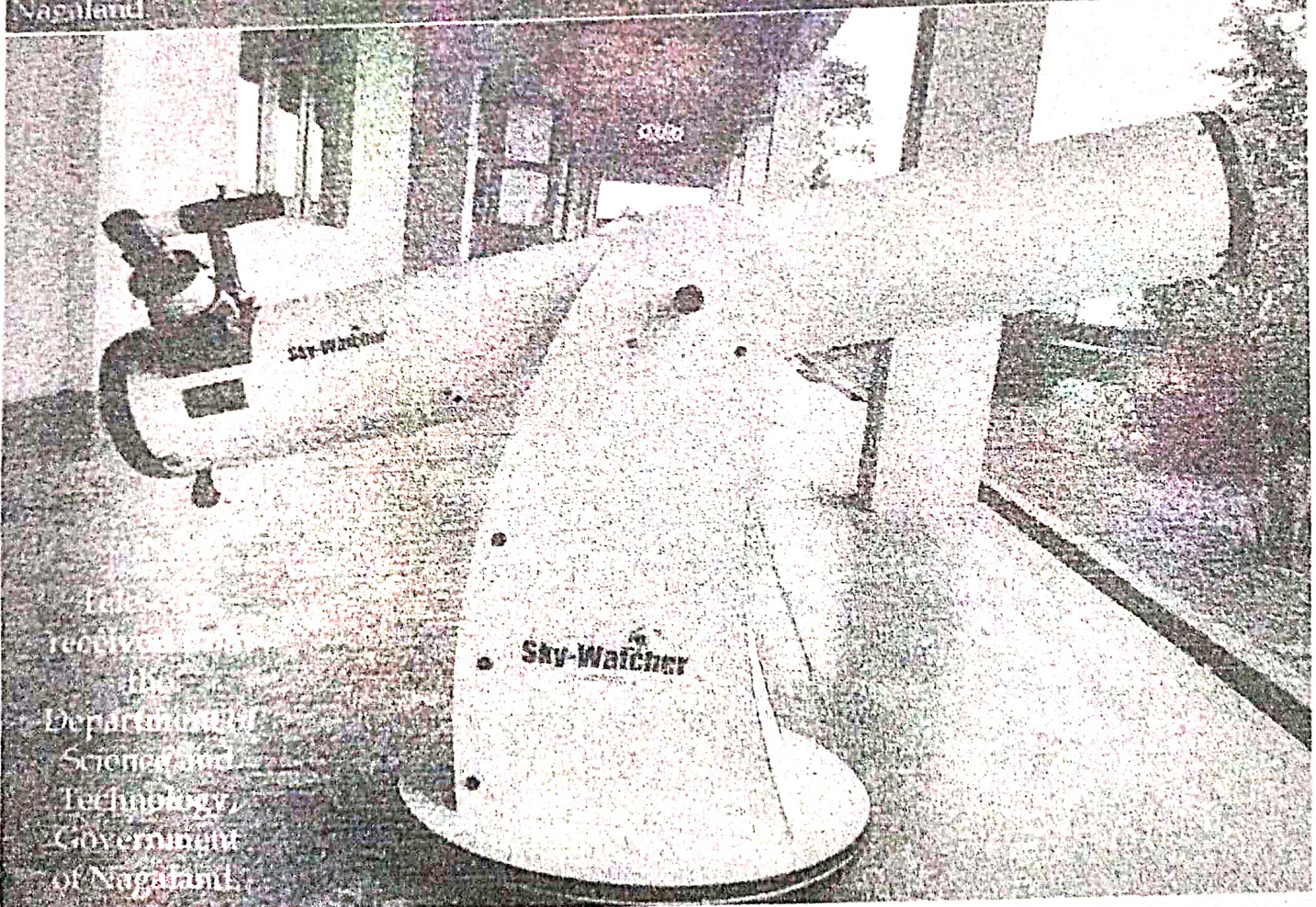

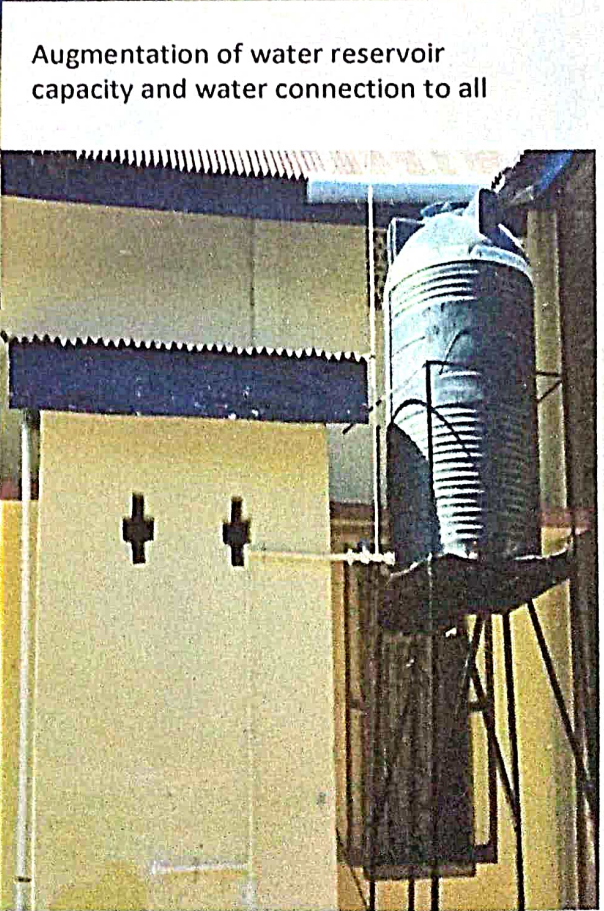
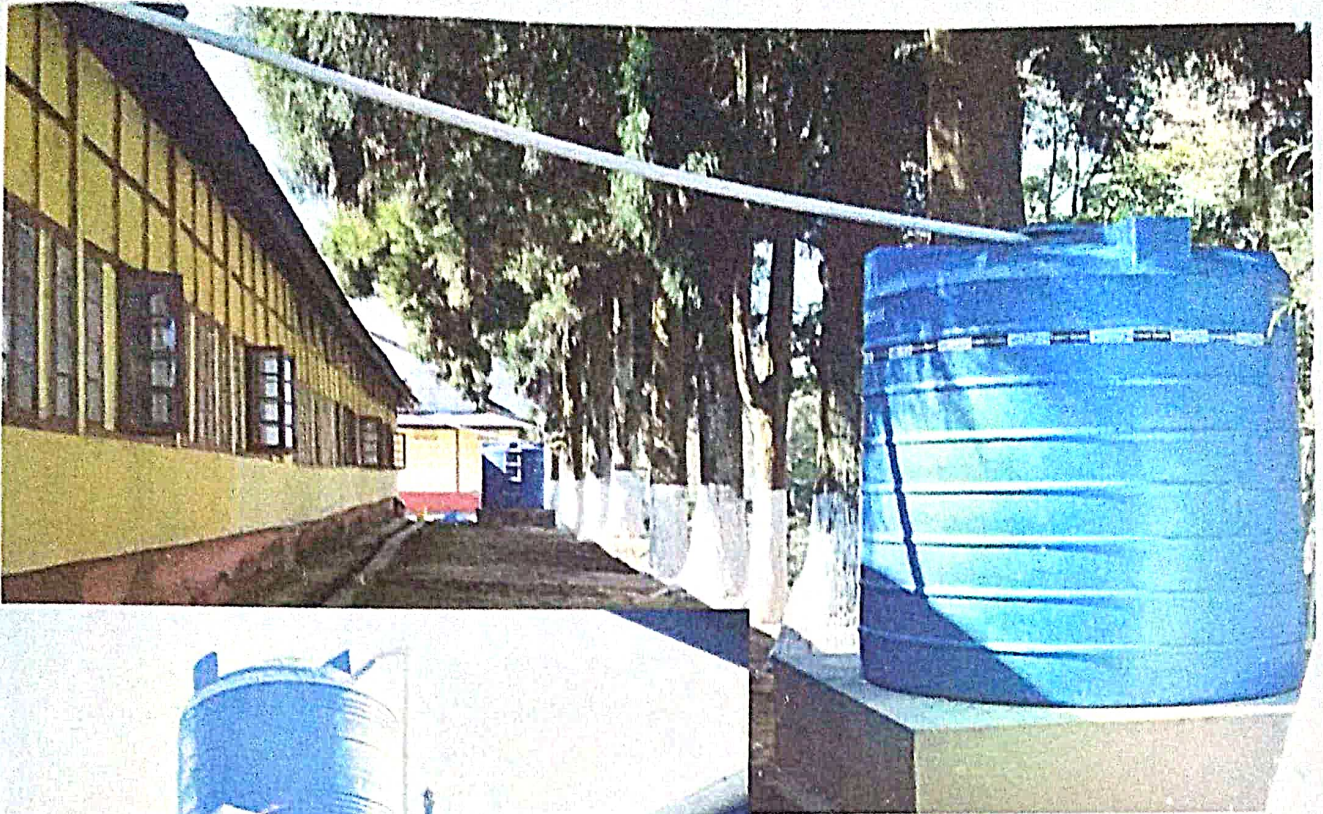
