ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The concept of "extended neighbourhood" is frequently portrayed by academics and other professionals as a more recent addition to India's external policy discourse and practice. Although the concept of extended neighbourhood has been gradually impacting India's foreign policy ever since independence, the word "extended neighbourhood" has become more popular in the last two decades or so in the expression of India's concerns about contemporary politics. The term "extended neighbourhood" have a close philosophical ethos which is likely one of the earliest expressions of the globalist perspective on international relations. It was a compact summary of the idea of a single universe in which events in one region always have an effect on the other polar end, even distantly. India's engagement with the world, especially its extended neighbourhood is driven by this sense of humanity's interconnectedness and shared aspirations. In our context, the term extended neighbourhood refers to countries sharing land and maritime borders with India such as China, Myanmar, Thailand, and Indonesia, apart from South Asia.

Greater engagement and reorientation of India's policy and strategic goals are required to bring closer to one another-geographically, economically, and culturally. Prime Minister Narendra Modi time and again reaffirmed that the 21st century would be the Asian century and poised conviction that India will play a leading role. As among the top fastest leading largest economies in world, India is most likely candidate to lead strategically significant Asia in the latter half of this century. In recent years, India's foreign policy has focused on deepening bilateral ties with strategically located Asian countries rather than forging a formal security alliance in the Indo-Pacific region alone to prevent direct conflict with other countries. The act of the present government is unmistakable. India is more prepared than ever to take part and make its presence felt on the international scene.

In fine, the idea of an extended neighbourhood fills a structural gap between India's current domineering power status in South Asia and the Indian Ocean, where it is geographically located, and its desired global power status. It is not exaggeration to claim that India views itself as a Great Power deserving of Great Power sphere of influence primarily in her extended neighbourhood. However, this scenario leads to a direct confrontation with resurgent China, which traditionally claims to be her sphere of influence. Therefore, India policy towards her extended neighbourhood has to be very sensitive, guided by a strategic vision, and walk a very delicate balance to achieve her objective. The conference will explore in detail many of these issues related to the concept of India's extended neighbourhood and its ramifications.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CONFERENCE

It is crucial to monitor the many facets of the new Asian alignments and India's involvement with its extended neighbourhood in this framework. The purpose of the conference is to identify prospects and challenges in India's near east that are crucial to India's ongoing transformation and its place in the world. The conference aims to achieve the following goals:

- To study its impact on changing geopolitical alignments in the region.
- To investigate its potential for diplomatic, socio-economic and cultural growth and development of India's extended neighbourhood.
- To identify competing and interlocking interests and work towards deepening relations with India's near east.
- To investigate the regional diversity, environmental mitigation, tourism, religious, migration and displacement and dialogue of multiple identities.
- To advance India's efforts to take on a bigger role in Asia by bringing the nations together on a common platform and making the "Asian Century" dream a reality.
