PROGRAMME OUTCOME (PO) 2024

PO1- Understanding Society- The course will familiarise the students with the fundamental ideas and viewpoints needed to comprehend and evaluate human societies. The curriculum aims to give students a thorough understanding of social institutions, social processes, and social structures.

PROGRAMME- COURSE OUTCOME OF FYUGP 2024

SUBJECT: SOCIOLOGY
