

COURSE OUTCOME NEW SYLLABUS FOR CBCS

1) Introduction to Sociology - I (CC-1)

CO 1- The students learn to apply the sociological perspectives in understanding how society helps in shaping an individual's life.

CO 2 – Understanding the nature, scope and origin of sociology and providing a foundation for the other more detailed and specialized courses in Sociology.

CO 3 - Assessing the relationship between Sociology and History, Sociology and Psychology, Sociology and Economics and Political science.

CO 4 - Classifying social process, Social Control and Social Change. Understanding society, institution and association.

By urging students to express their opinions on difficult modern subjects with invited lectures, webinars, and presentations, their verbal abilities are improved.
