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
17 FEBRUARY 2026

Marathon Race with NSS and Sports Committee

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) Between Fazl Ali College and the Office of the Chief Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Officer, Mokokchung District

Fazl Ali College, Mokokchung, formally executed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Office of the Chief Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Officer, Mokokchung District, on February 19, 2026 at the College campus. The agreement institutionalizes a framework for structured academic collaboration and technical cooperation between the two entities. The formulation of this agreement was undertaken through the academic facilitation of the Department of Zoology, Fazl Ali College.

The MoU seeks to facilitate interdisciplinary engagement in the areas of animal husbandry, veterinary sciences, and livestock management.

Dr. I. Wati Imchen, Principal, Fazl Ali College, underscored the contemporary relevance of the animal husbandry and veterinary sector in addressing emerging challenges in livestock health, food security, and rural livelihoods. He emphasized that the MoU would constitute a vital institutional mechanism for integrating academic scholarship with applied field expertise, thereby strengthening professional preparedness among students.

Dr. Tiachuba, Chief Veterinary Officer, Mokokchung District, commended the proactive initiative of the Department and affirmed that the Office would extend full institutional support to ensure sustained and productive collaboration under the framework of the agreement.

Awareness on Mental Health and NALSA DAWN Scheme

“Awareness on Mental Health and NALSA DAWN scheme” was organized by Mokochung District Legal Services Authority (MDLSA) in collaboration with the Internal Task Force Committee on Mental Health (FAC).

Objectives:

1. To sensitize students about legal protections and raise awareness of the NALSA DAWN Scheme, 2025, which addresses the drug menace through wellness navigation.
2. To bring awareness of Mental Health among the students.
3. To encourage community support and rehabilitation.
4. To create awareness about the dangers of drug abuse and its legal consequences.

Participants: 400 students (approx.) with 6 faculty members.

Program Outcomes:

- Awareness on NALSA DAWN Scheme, under Article 39A of the Constitution, which ensures free legal aid for all, including adults, women, and children, in civil and criminal cases.
- Role of Lok Adalat in resolving assault and loan disputes while safeguarding the human rights of all individuals, including the accused.
- A concise guide on navigating legal cases and how free legal aid supports underprivileged individuals within the court system.
- A deeper understanding of mental health, the types and impacts of trauma and the process of healing.
- Legal awareness on substance abuse and the legal measures to combat it under the NALSA DAWN Scheme 2025 and the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

The panel featured Dr. Watimongla Pongener, Associate Professor (Retd.) and former Head of the Department of English, FAC; Mr. S. Imkongtiba Longkumer, Assistant Professor in the Department of Zoology, FAC; and Mr. Akangtemsu Yaden, Youth Director of MTBA Youth Ministry. Ms. Maongienla, Assistant Professor, Department of English moderated the session. A question and answer session followed the panel talk.



10-13 MARCH 2026

Campus E-Waste Awareness and Collection Drive by Eco Club

Fazl Ali College organized an awareness programme on “E-Waste Management” as part of its week-long e-waste collection drive conducted from March 9 to 12, 2026. The initiative was organized in collaboration with E-Circle and sponsored by Earth Alliance, with the aim of promoting awareness about the environmental and health impacts of electronic waste and encouraging responsible disposal and recycling practices.

The session was moderated by Ms. Chubamenla Chang, Assistant Professor, Department of Geography. The resource person for the session, Ms. Bendangwala Walling, co-founder of E-Circle, spoke on the increasing presence of electronic waste in everyday life due to the rapid use of technology. She explained the key principles of responsible e-waste management—reduce, reuse, segregate, recycle and recover; while highlighting the environmental and health hazards associated with improper disposal of electronic devices.

The Department of Zoology undertook a field trip to Kohora Range (Central Range) in Kaziranga National Park, Assam

The Department of Zoology, Fazl Ali College, Mokokchung, undertook a field trip to Kohora Range (Central Range) in Kaziranga National Park, Assam from 13- 14 March 2026.
